1924-26: The Columbia University Statistical Laboratory (location unknown) includes Hollerith tabulating, punching, and sorting machines, Burroughs adding machines, Brunsviga and Millionaire calculators (the latter was the first device to perform direct multiplication), plus reference works such as math and statistical tables. 1900 Federal immigration policy entices Eastern Europeans to Canadian West. 1901 Marconi receives the first transatlantic radio message at St. John's, Newfoundland.
